The Journey to the Cross

“Come, Follow Me.”

The church calendar leads us through the life, death and resurrection of Christ. During this season of Lent, we have been following Luke's account of Christ's journey to Jerusalem. In the week leading up to Easter, we will journey with Christ to the cross:

Easter Week Services:

- Palm Sunday, March 20—We remember the triumphal entry into Jerusalem, and we also remember how quickly our lives can go from victory to defeat.
- Seder Meal, March 24th, 6pm. We will celebrate a Christian Passover meal together, through food, Scripture, and song.
- Good Friday service, March 25th, 6pm. We will walk through Christ's journey to the cross.
- Easter Sunday, March 27th—We will celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Savior together!

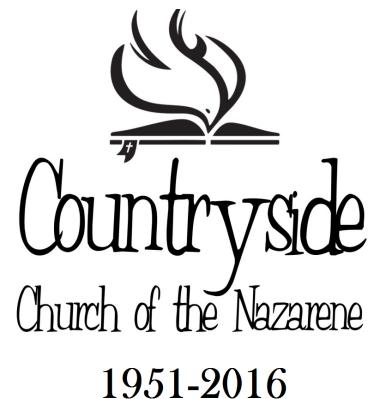
